## Judge's Comments:

Denver, the mile high city! You have to love their mountains. The weather was beautiful and I hope those of you who traveled from far were able to take in some of the surrounding scenery.

15 Exhibitors brought 147 birds - I secretly said to myself that I must be crazy to want to judge this many birds. But I'm here and I had to get to the job at hand.

The birds that are brought to a National are, or should be, the best of the best. You, the exhibitor should have shown your birds at several local shows. They should know how to behave in a show box, know how to react to the judge's stick. Basically, they should know what to do once they are placed in the show box.

This year I saw a lot of birds that where not in good condition and that came to play in determining how they placed in their class, Section and then finally the division. I had some discussion with the exhibitors sitting in the gallery about the condition of the birds and they all agreed that they were not in the best condition that they should have been. We determined that the reason for this was the unusually warm weather that we had this fall and a lot of the birds were now just going through a molt. This was evident by the amount of feathers that came flying out of the show boxes.

I saw a lot of very nice birds and, at least, one very nice Orangefaced Pied that took the Best Bird in Division. Unfortunately, it was not bred or banded by the exhibitor; therefore, the Higgins went to the second place bird, a very nice Blue Australian Cinnamon, exhibited by Jim Munis, who is no new comer to winning a National.

Section 1: Green Peachfaced, 22 entries - I have said more than once that I remember when the Green Peachfaced Section was the largest Section in a show. Now, I guess I'm showing my age. Two birds from this Section placed on the Top Bench and both were Orangefaced.

Section 2; Blue Peachfaced, 19 entries - 4 birds made it to Top Bench.

Section 3: Green Pied Peachfaced, 7 entries - the show winner came from this Section, as did the  $7^{th}$  and  $15^{th}$  place birds. I was pleased at how nice the Pieds were because they have a habit of looking fluffed and some times don't show well, but that was not the case at the National, they did very well.

Section 4: Blue Pied Peachfaced, 16 entries – a very nice group of Pieds. Two finished on the Top Bench in  $4^{th}$  and  $9^{th}$  place.

Section 5: American Cinnamon Peachfaced, 16 entries - the 3<sup>rd</sup> place bird came from this Section. It was a very nice, well proportioned Blue American Cinnamon, which I had in first place for a while, but it just didn't hold up well enough to stay in first.

Section 6: Australian Cinnamon, 9 entries - at one time, this Section was very popular with exhibitors. I still think there is nothing like a nice Orangefaced Australian Cinnamon. I really like the color combination. The 2nd place bird came from this Section and won the Higgins, with another coming in last at 19<sup>th</sup>. Both Australian Cinnamons were bred, banded and exhibited by Jim Munis.

Section 7: Violet Peachfaced, 13 entries - between the Blue Section and the Violet Section is where I think I came down with a headache. Violets where in the Blue Section and Blues in the Biolet Section. We tried to straighten them out, but I heard later that at least one bird was still incorrectly classified and none of the Violets made Top Bench.

Section 8: Opaline Peachfaced, 34 entries - if someone told me 7 years ago that there would be 34 birds in the Opaline Section, and nice bird birds at that, I would have told them "Yeah Right!" Well, we did and they where nice sized birds, but again condition problems kept them from getting on the Top Bench; although, there was an Orangefaced Medium Green Opaline that made  $6^{th}$  place.

Section 9: Longfeathered Peachfaced, 4 entries - it has been my experience that Longfeathered's can have the tendency not to show well. They droop their wings, and like the Pieds sit fluffed up. I'm sure there are Longfeathered that do show well, but unfortunately they didn't show well at this show.

I had 7 Champions and as we all know, they are judged the hardest, after all they are Champions. The Opaline was my best Champion and I thought a show winner, until it came up for Top Bench. It had managed to mess up its feathers and so it only finished 11<sup>th</sup>. I was very disappointed because I thought that this bird was going to go all the way ... maybe next time.

I want to thank all the exhibitors for bringing their birds to the National. I know how hard it can be to travel with birds to a show, and we won't even get into the expense. So, I consider it an honor to judge them. I hope you learned something that you can take home and apply to your breeding program or help you with showing.
