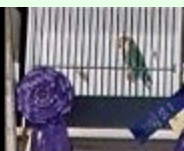

PHIL RYAN’S COMMENTS FOR BOTH DIVISIONS

Judges Comments:
We had beautiful weather for this show. The skies were bright and the temperature was about 70 degrees. It was shirt sleeve weather all the way. The show was held in a separate building at a recreation complex.

This show was only for Love birds so we had the two Love Bird Divisions of “Peach Faced” and “Rares and Eye rings”. There were a total of 140 entries in the two divisions – 80 in Peach Faced and 60 in Rares and Eyerings”. This was a major show. There were entries in all sections in both divisions except for Long Feather in the Peach Faced division. I will treat the two divisions separately for this report

Rare and Eye Ring Division – 60 entries

The largest section was Fischer’s with 36 entries. The next largest section was Masked with 22 entries followed by Rares with 1 entry. The pre-show classifications were well done with only a very few re-classifications.

The top bird was a very good Medium Green Fischer’s. I look for birds which demonstrate “Fischerness” in both body conformation and color. This bird had it all – very clean lines of demarcation between color areas, good body proportions and good cage conduct. Right behind that bird was another Fischer’s with similar credentials with the exception of cage conduct. The third place bird was a medium blue Masked with a very good sooty black face. Seven of the top eleven birds were Fischer’s and four were Masked. The lone entry in the Rares section was a color mutation Black Cheeked which did not have the colors in the right places on the body.

At one point near the end of the judging process we had the top 11 candidates on the bench. The bench was wide enough for 6 cages so they were in two rows, one above the other. I stepped back to look at them and noticed that every one of the birds on the top bench were on their perches and every one of the birds on the second row were on the floor of their cage.

There was one Champion bird entered. A green pied Fischer’s would have placed 6 based on not being in great condition.

The best unflighted bird was a dark green Fischer’s.

The overall condition of the entries was quite good. Most were in good feather and good condition. The organization of the show was very professional.

There were 8 exhibitors and 7 of them placed birds in the top 11. That is a very competitive show.

Peach Faced Division – 80 entries

The top bird was a beautiful Australian Cinnamon White Face. It was in excellent condition, had great color and its posture in the show cage was as good as I have seen. Second was an Orange Faced Lutino which had no evidence of a common problem in Lutinos with a long, narrow bill. This bird also had very good condition and conformation. Third place was an Orange Faced Opaline which had great size and body conformation. Nine of the top 13 birds were variations on Orange Faced.

There was one champion bird entered. This was a green Orange Faced and I would have placed it fourth.

The best novice exhibitor bird was a Blue Pied.

I was impressed with the quality of the opaline birds. Most of them were in very good condition, the conformation was close to outstanding and the size was just right. In the past the palines have tended to be small but selective breeding has worked here.

There were 8 exhibitors and once again 7 of them placed birds in the top 13. Again, this was a very competitive show.

My thanks to the club for inviting me and for giving me the opportunity to judge their ALBS show. This is a great club and their show was well organized. My thanks also to Danny Cardona for handling the details of travel, to Luis Ramos for working as secretary and to Adalberto Ocasio for his work as steward for the Rares and Eye-Rings. Also, my thanks to Luis Ocasio for his work as secretary and to Danny Cardona for his work as steward for the Peachfaced division. A great job was done by all.
