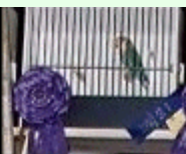

Judge's Comments:

I had the pleasure of judging the second show of the day for the MACBE in Charlotte held on a rather warm Saturday, June 11th. Needless to say, a lot of the birds were not in tip top condition at this time of year however, a good number were. The show consisted of 70 birds exhibited by six very seasoned and competitive exhibitors from New York to Georgia.

A summary of the top birds is, the Best in Division went to a Lutino Opaline owned by J. D.

Ferrigno. This bird had amazing head color, a brilliantly pristine yellow body and was in perfect condition. This bird may have the best evenly distributed and extensive head color of any opaline I have judged. Second in the Division was an excellent Violet Pied again owned by J. D. Ferrigno. The bird had beautiful clear flights, coloration and condition. Congratulations again to John for a job well done. Third place in the Division went to a beautiful Black-cheeked owned by Susan Saylor. Susan is a master conditioner and does an excellent job breeding consistent quality Black-cheeks. Another one of her birds on top bench worthy of mentioning was a extremely nice Dilute Blue Masked that placed 7th.

This show included eight Champions which equates to over 10% of the birds entered! All Champions are note worthy, but in the spirit of brevity, I will mention that Linna Reusman's gorgeous Champion female Aby was ranked first place in the show and Susan's beautiful Champion Black-cheeked that is unforgettable was ranked as second place Champion and second in show.

As always thanks be to those that assisted in secretary duties, ribbon tying, stewarding, setting up and tearing down and especially to the exhibitors who for the most part traveled great distances with not so cheap gas and put a lot of time and hard work into feeding, conditioning, and other husbandry to make this show possible and a joy to judge. It is also worth mentioning the friendship and support these exhibitors share with each other is truly remarkable.
